Love and respect the student

you are meeting with, no matter what!

Meet monthly

It will be your responsibility to set up a meeting time and place each month.

The first Wednesday of each month after worship is set aside for mentor time (come to worship at 6 P.M. and then meet afterwards), but it can occur at another time if necessary. Just so it is at least once a month. Forms will track mentor meetings.

Be a trusted confidante

so your student knows he or she can confide in you.

However if you feel for any reason your student is in danger at home or school, contact Paul Blom or Laurie Neill immediately.

Maintain communication

with your student outside of the time you meet each month.

Ideas:

Send an encouraging e-mail or text message now and then.

Join Facebook or add your student as a friend.

Give a call to check in.

Help your student see how God is working in your/their life.

Share how God has worked in your life, and continues to do so on a daily basis and help them see God in their lives. Assist your student with the final project of their story if needed.
